


This winter's tour pre-lesson explores each of the Elements of Art: color, line, shape, space, and texture through a series of short 10-minute "**bell-ringer**" activities.

What is LINE?

On the board, draw as many different LINES you can think of?



EXPLORE LINE!


"A LINE is a dot that went for a walk." – Paul Klee

LINE: A mark with greater length than width. Lines can be horizontal, vertical, or diagonal; straight or curved; Thick or thin.

Spend a couple of minutes looking closely at a work of art! (see next slide)

How many different lines do you see? How would you describe them?

Let's create a drawing out of LINES!



paper

pencil



READY, SET... ART!

♦ On a piece of paper draw a U-shape near the bottom of the paper.

◆ Next, choose 5 different kinds of lines to grow out of the U-shape.

Repeat each line 5 times to fill up the whole space of the paper.

Add a neck, shoulders, and a face to create a self-portrait on a crazy hair day!











End the activity in a gallery stroll so everyone can see each other's work!



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
