

### Roll a Portrait Art Activity!

pARTners – Compare | Contrast Fall 2019

## Materials included in this packet:

- instructions
- die template (1 per student)
- game cards (1 per student)
- frames page (1 per student)

### Additional materials needed:

- scissors
- glue or tape
- pencils
- art making supplies (markers, crayons, colored pencils, etc.)

# **Instructions:**

**1. Assemble dice.** Each student will need a dice template, scissors, glue or tape. Tape is easier!

- cut out the dice and fold into a cube beginning with the inner black solid lines.
- fold the dotted line tabs inward to connect the dice together.
- tape or glue the dotted line tabs to assemble.
- 2. Play Roll a Portrait game! This game of chance will create a duo of portraits! - every student will need a pencil, dice, game card, and frames page. Have a selection of art materials available to students (markers, crayons, colored pencils, etc.).

- begin on the "1st turn face shape."

- roll the dice. Look for the number on the dice and match it to the dice pictured in the first row. If you are on the first turn and you rolled a 3 on the dice, then you would draw a triangle shape on your paper in one of your frames.

- continue on to turn 2 and then the next turn until your drawing is done.

- students will play the game two times and create two different portraits, one in each frame. One the back of the game card, roll again to add details to both portraits.

### tips and tricks!

- students should think about using the whole frame for their portraits and details. Small and tiny drawings don't work well with this activity.

- face shapes should be pretty large in order to add details inside of it.

- after students have completed both portraits, have them discuss how their portraits are the same and different.
