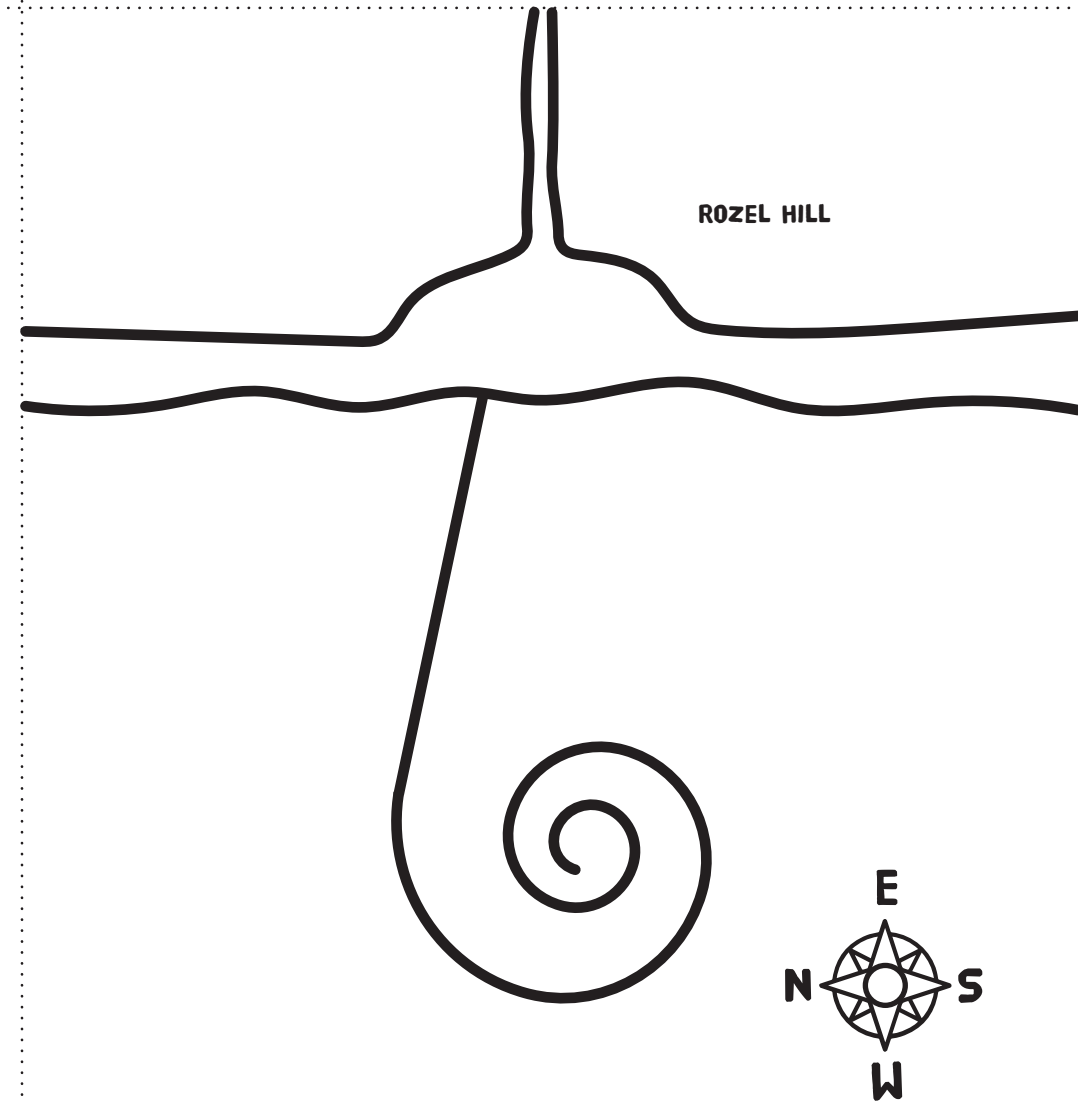


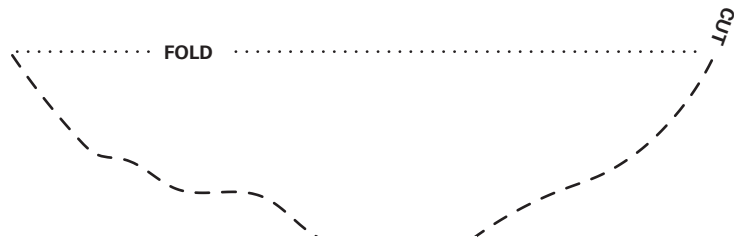

How to get to *Spiral Jetty*

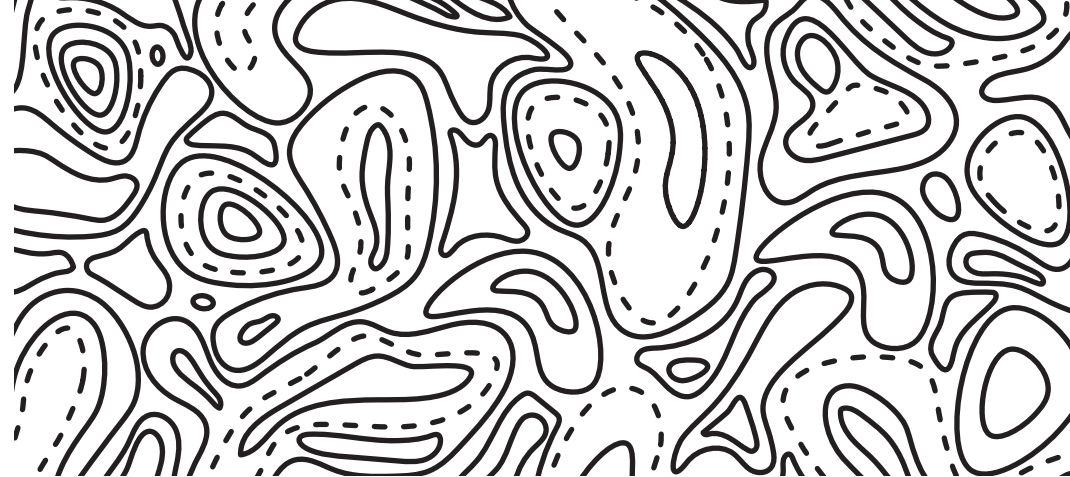
Spiral Jetty is about 2.5 hours from Salt Lake City.
